MINISTRY TO THE HOMEBOUND

"Every day they devoted themselves to meeting together in the temple area and to breaking bread in their homes. They ate their meals with exultation and sincerity of heart, praising God and enjoying favor with all the people." Acts 2:46, 47

It is clear that the early Christians found great joy in communing with God and each other. They stayed close by "breaking the bread" – by sharing God's presence with each other. With so much joy and togetherness, it must have felt difficult to miss this celebration when they were ill or unable to attend. They would have felt very much alone if it hadn't been for those same wonderful Christians who cared enough to bring the Lord to them.

The act of bringing the Lord to those who are unable to attend Mass is as old as the Eucharist itself. The act of simply being present to them is even older. There are those who miss the presence of the Lord in the Eucharist and those who simply miss the presence of the Lord because of the lack of people around them.
